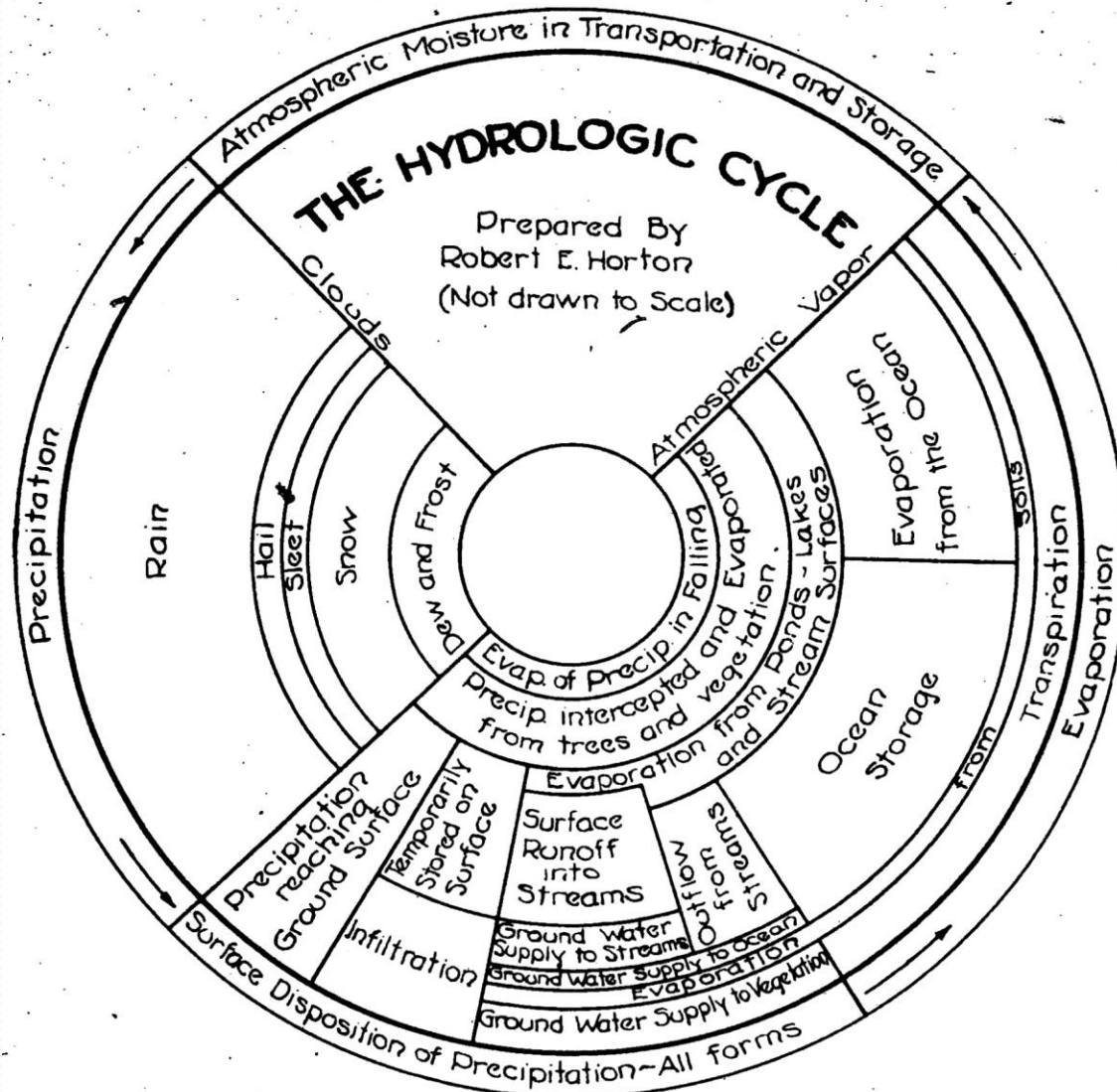
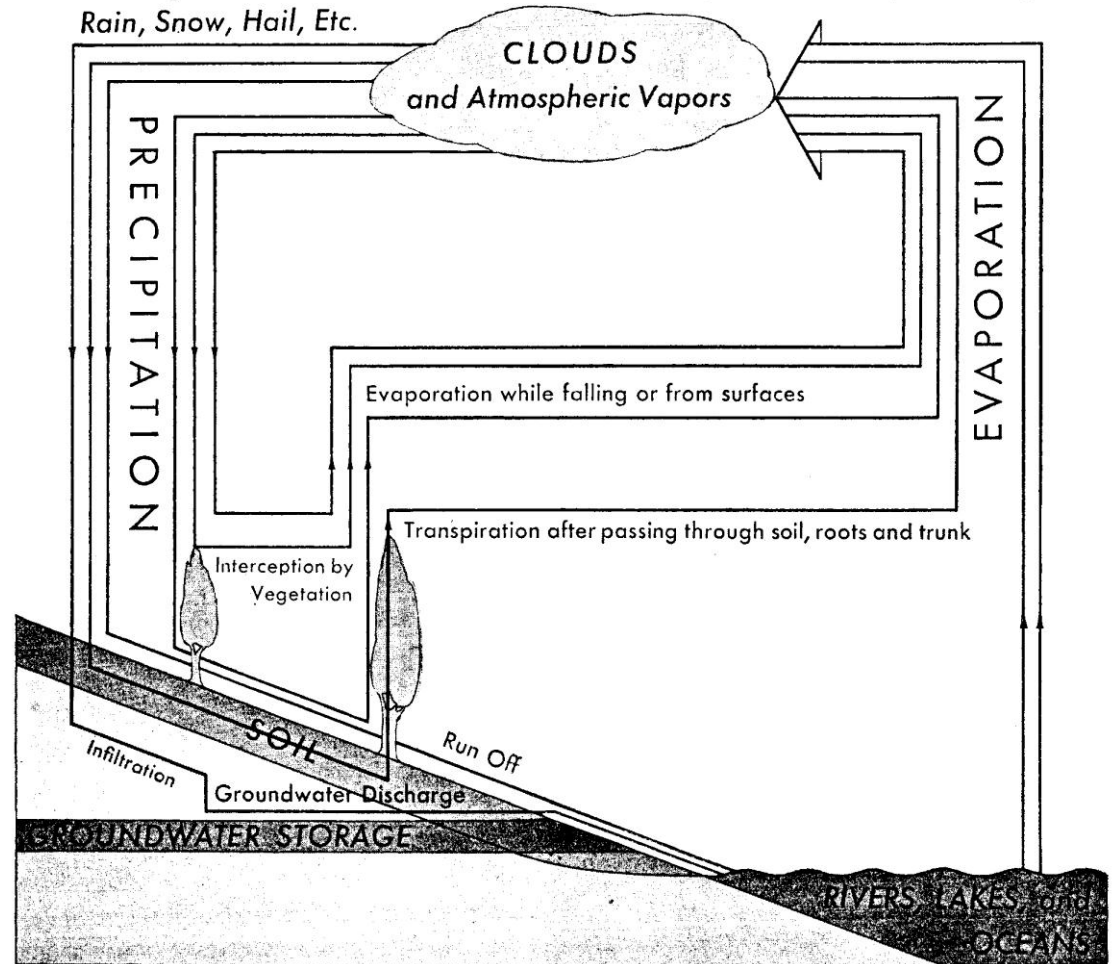


Fig. 1--The hydrologic cycle

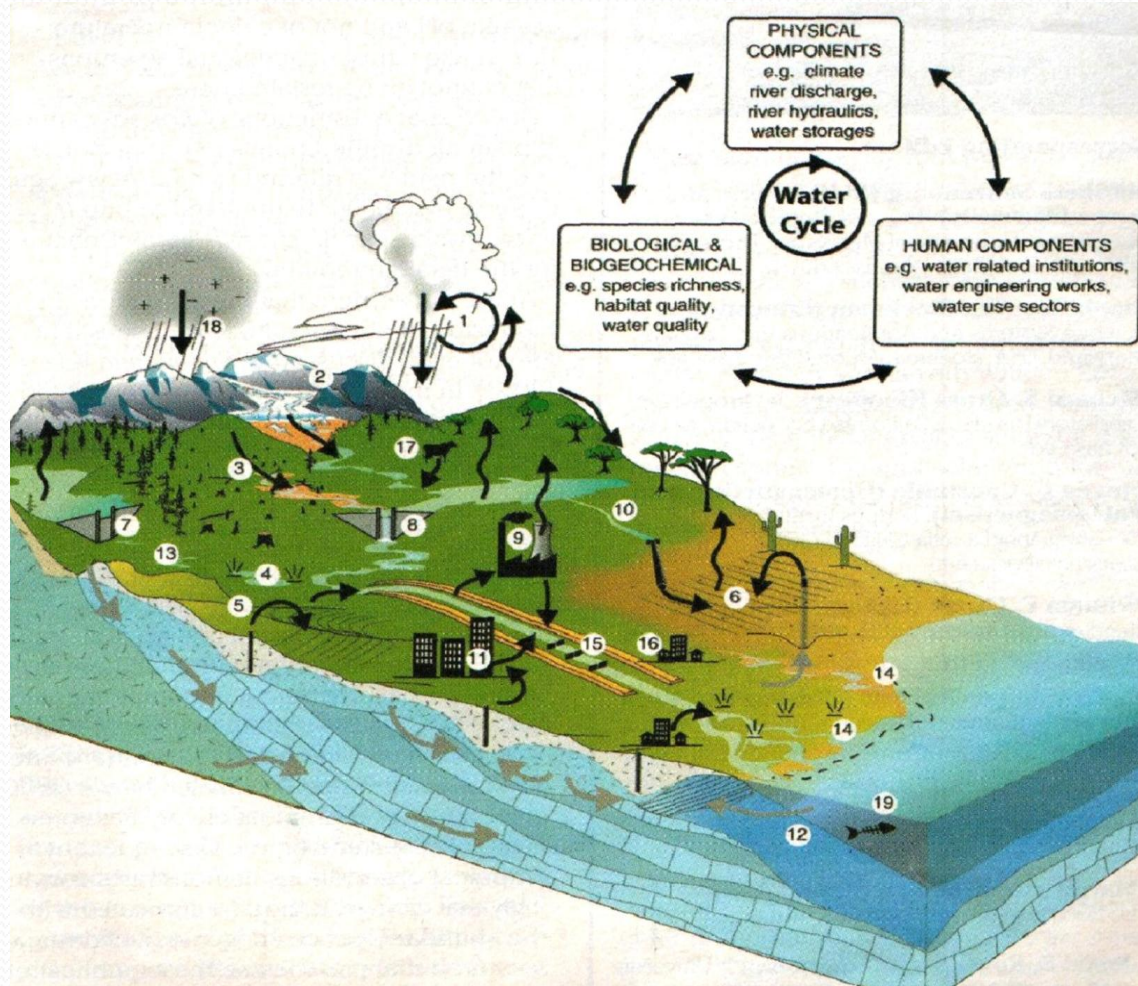

Precipitation and the Hydrologic Cycle

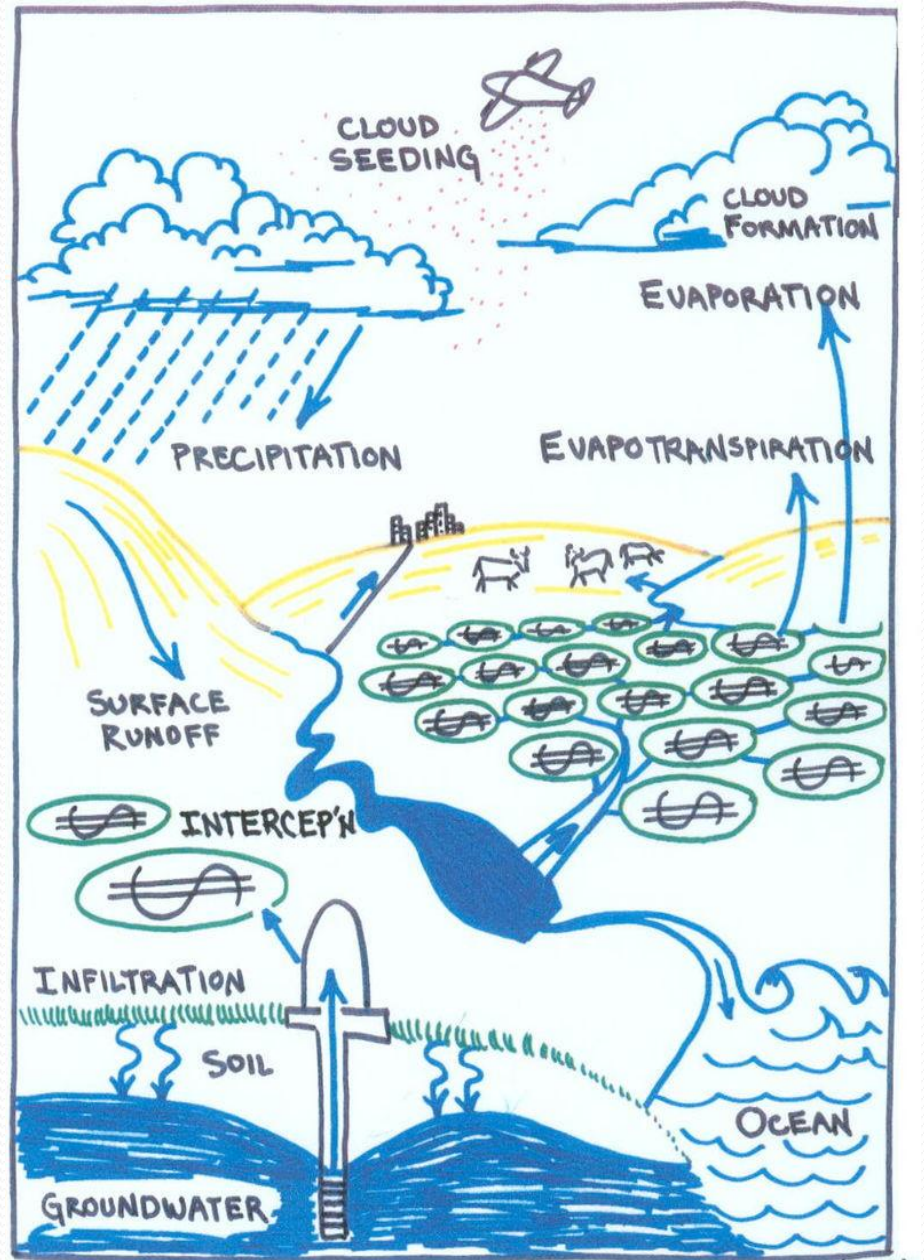

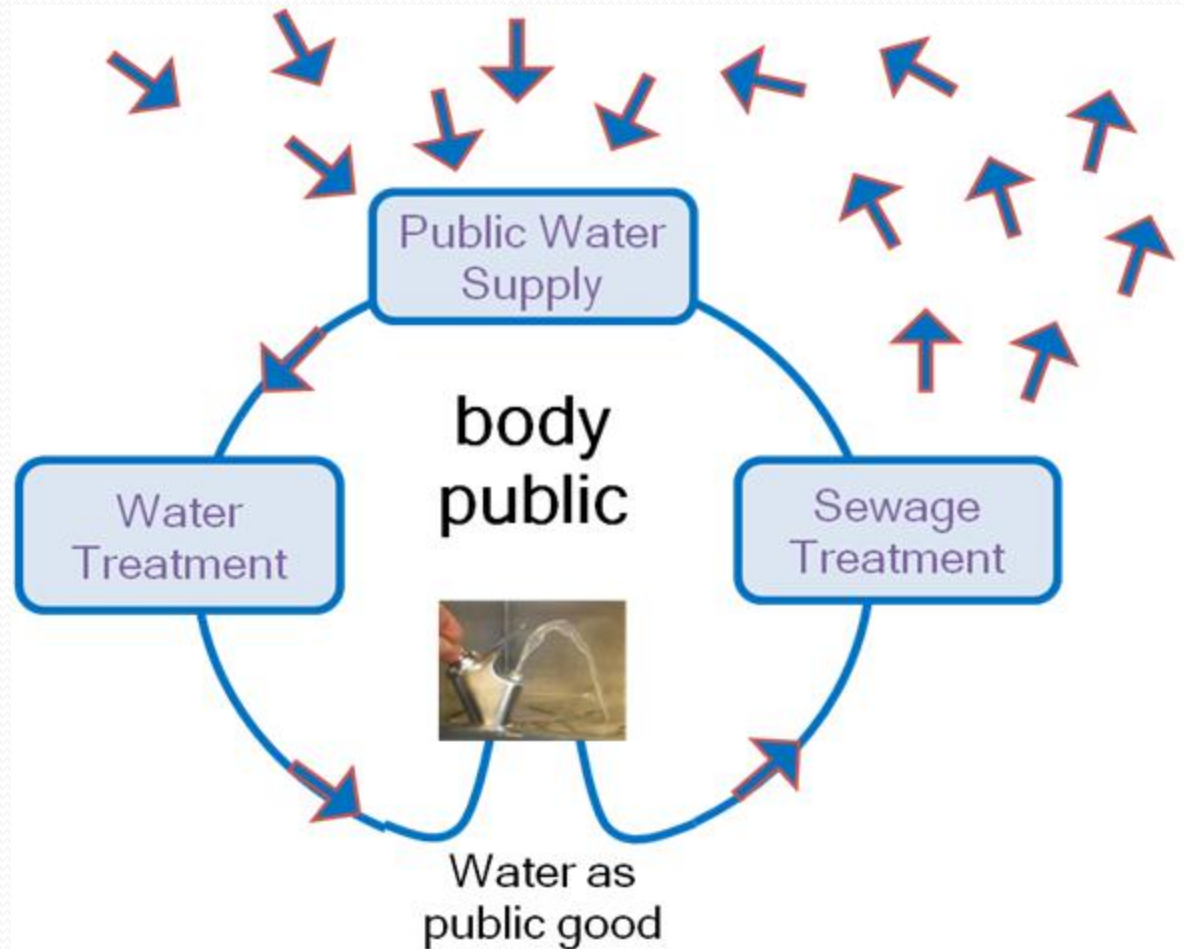
